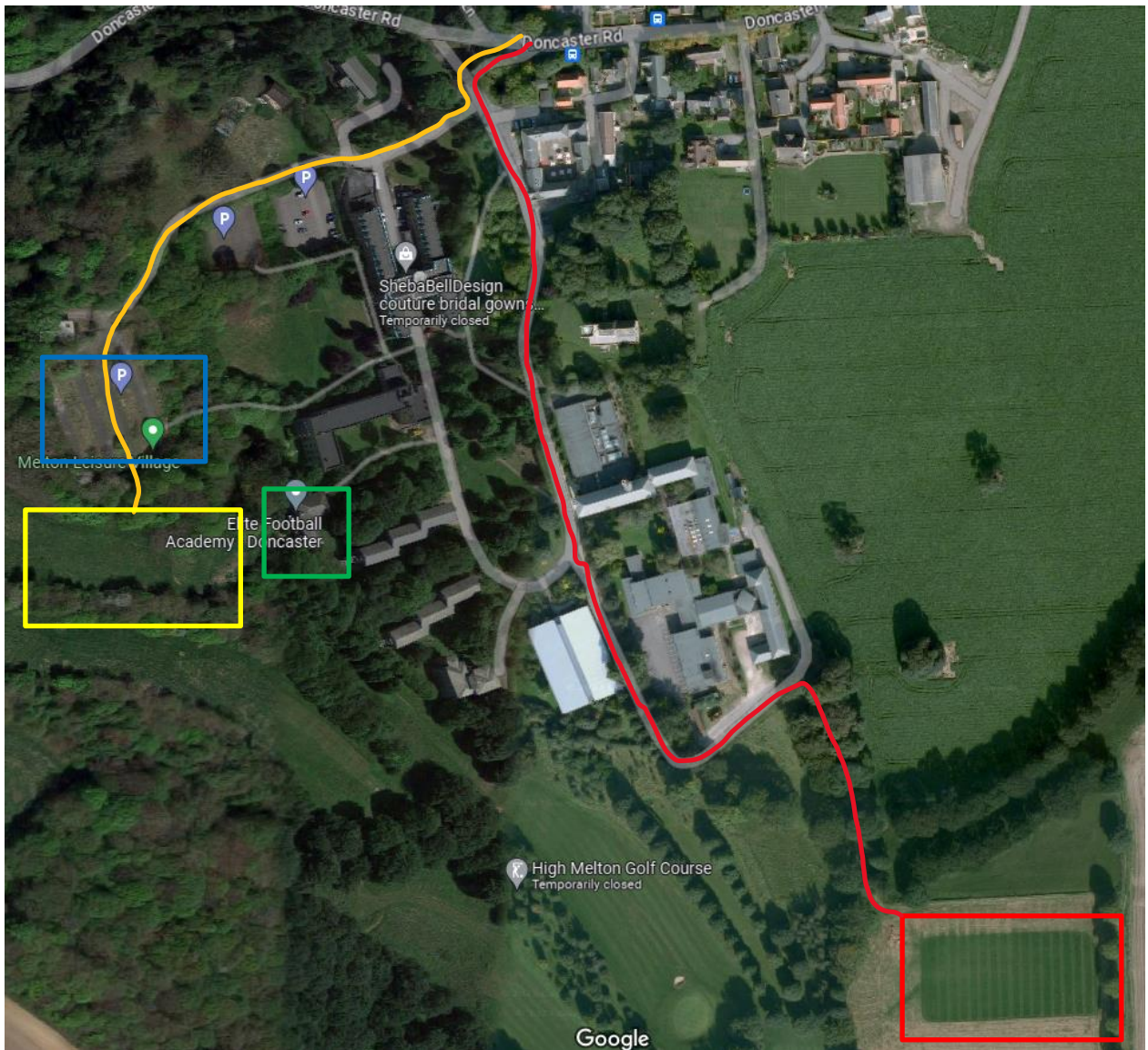

Access Routes	
Ambulance (Bottom Pitch)	Through the main entrance from Doncaster road, turn right and follow road to the bottom car park, end of car park there is double gate leading from car park to field.
Ambulance (Top Pitch)	Through the main entrance from Doncaster road, straight on through two sets of gates, straight on up towards top field.

During the game (DEFA Team only)

When the first aider / therapist enters the field of play, the therapist will automatically gather between the home and away dugouts and wait for their assistance to be called upon. If they are called onto the pitch they will bring all medical gear onto the field of play. The signal for the therapist to enter the pitch is hands crossed above the head. The therapist will take the lead role in the initial communication with the first aiders.

There should be a treatment plan agreed between all parties either to treat or transfer the patient immediately. If life support treatment is commenced on pitch, the coaching staff at the facility will maintain a perimeter around the player for dignity and privacy. If it is decided that transferring the player from the field of play is the best option, the stretchered player shall be transferred to the first aid room.

If an ambulance is required, a member of staff should make an appropriate call to 999, asking for an ambulance and informing them of the incident, details of the player and location of the incident. A member of the coaching staff should then make their way to the main road to direct the ambulance to the scene of the accident.

Bar staff should also be informed to open necessary gates and inform DEFA staff that they need to be made available on Doncaster Road to direct the ambulance towards the incident.

First aid equipment (medical gear) will consist of a stretcher, AED, general first aid kit, neck brace, splints, crutches, suction device, bag and valve mask (junior and adults).

During the game (Away Team only)

The away team will be responsible for all medical treatments (including pitch side care) needed for their players. In the event of a life threatening emergency the away team must signal the home team sports therapist who will take the lead informing them of any allergies or medical issues that could complicate the treatment.

Directions to Doncaster Royal Infirmiry Hospital

Doncaster Royal Infirmiry, Armthorpe Rd, Doncaster, South Yorkshire DN2 5LT.

Approximate journey time 18 minutes.

1. Out of the main gates and turn right to continue on Melton Road.
2. Continue onto Sprotbrough Road.
3. At the roundabout, take the 3rd exit onto St. Georges Bridge/A19.
4. At the roundabout, take the 2nd exit onto Church Way/A630.
5. Turn right onto Wentworth Road.
6. Continue onto Armthorpe Road.
7. Accidents and Emergency department and parking will be on the right hand side.
